## Waste Avoidance and Resource Recovery Strategy 2030

VISION	Western Australia will become a sustainable, low-waste, circular economy in which human health and the environment are protected from the impacts of waste.		
OBJECTIVES	Avold Western Australians generate less waste.	Recover Western Australians recover more value and resources from waste.	Protect Western Australians protect the environment by managing waste responsibly.
TARGETS	2025 – 10% reduction in waste generation per capita     2030 – 20% reduction in waste generation per capita	2025 – Increase material recovery to 70%     2030 – Increase material recovery to 75%     From 2020 – Recover energy only from residual waste	2030 – No more than 15% of waste generated in Perth and Peel regions is landfilled.     2030 – All waste is managed and/or disposed to better practice facilities

#### **Focus Materials**

- Organics: food organics and garden organics (FOGO)
- Construction and demolition waste
- Metals
- Paper and cardboard
- Glass
- Plastics
- Textiles
- Hazardous waste

#### **MSW Target**

 2030 – Increase MSW material recovery to 70% in the Perth and Peel regions, 60% in major regional centres

#### **Headline Strategy**

A consistent three bin kerbside collection system, which includes separation of food organics and garden organics from other waste categories, to be provided by all local governments in the Perth and Peel region by 2025 and supported by State Government through the application of financial mechanisms.
